The recognised 'White card' for construction industry employment is issued by WorkSafe Victoria.

**HRD** construction induction training covers the skills and knowledge required for a general induction to working in rail construction, in the wider construction industry, or in employment situation where there's a need for WHS awareness.

## Training & Assessment

#### Course content

Content includes:

- identifying OHS legislative requirements
- construction risks, hazards and control measures
- OHS communication
- Incident/emergency response procedures.



#### Your training

White card training has a mixture of classroom theory and practical activity. Some learning activities may be delivered online.

Participants must be able to read, write and understand English.

HRD takes your training seriously and will prepare you for entry onto a construction site. The course runs over a minimum of 6 hours, but participants should allow up to 8 hours from start to finish.

#### Course outcomes

On successful completion of training you'll be able to demonstrate:

- awareness of OHS/WHS legislative requirements, including duty of care
- basic principles of risk management and preventing injury and illness in a construction workplace
- emergency response procedure.

#### Assessment

Participants must successfully complete a written theory test (pass mark = 100%) and competently demonstrate the use of PPE.



- The course addresses the *National Code of Practice for Induction Training for Construction Work* training program.
- Rail-specific content makes this course relevant to prospective rail employees.
- Participants develop an understanding workplace duty of care responsibilities.

**Training has a rail flavour, with reference made to common rail industry safework practices. However, general construction is also covered in detail so participants not intending to work in rail will be well prepared to enter any construction site.**
